



## HENLEY MIDMAR YACHT CLUB PUB RULES

Following the granting of the Club's Liquor Licence and further to information received from the Liquor Licencing Authorities, and KZN Liquor Board, it is of the essence that the following rules and regulations are complied with at the club:

- (1) No liquor whatsoever is to be sold on the club premises, without the relative licence being displayed at the point of sale.
  - (2) No liquor is to be sold off the premises at any stage.
  - (3) No liquor is to be sold outside the defined trading hours.
  - (4) No liquor is allowed to be served unopened and may not be taken outside the licenced area of the club. (A plan of the area is available)
  - (4) No liquor whatsoever is to be sold to a person under the age of 18 years, or to a (visibly) pregnant women.
  - (6) No person under the age of 18 years, is allowed in the (delineated) bar area.
  - (7) No liquor is to be sold to a person who is already heavily intoxicated.
  - (8) No liquor may be sold to any other person than a club member, their bona-fide guest, visiting yachtsmen and yachtswomen or sporting bodies taking part in an organized event at the club, or to a person attending a club social occasion and for no other purpose whatsoever, unless applied for in writing and granted by the Chairman of the KZN Liquor Board.  
(All non members must be signed on in the Visitor/Guest Book)
  - (9) No liquor may be brought into and/or onto the licenced area of the club, without the permission of the licensee.
  - (10) However members who are over 18 years old and are camping or picnicking in the club grounds (Not the Verandas) or working on their boats in the boat-park area, may consume their own liquor as long as it is within the legal constraints of drinking in a public place.
- NB: For Private Functions, or for the sale of liquor from any other point in the club grounds outside the licenced area, a temporary liquor licence must be obtained from the Magistrates Court in Howick, as a Club Liquor Licence cannot legally be transferred, to a second party.

The consequences of the club being involved, or proven to have complicity in the above not being adhered too, can result in the club having its liquor licence cancelled, along with stiff fines and/or the closure of the club premises. We do not want to take the club down this road, so each and every member needs to be aware of the above and comply with these rules and regulations for the club's sake. Let us enjoy the privilege of having our own licenced pub and safeguard its future.
